Annie Johnson Flint (1866-1932)

- Born on Christmas Eve 1866 as Annie Johnson in NJ
- Mother died when she was 3 yrs old
- Taken in by the Flints, a true Christian family, and chose their name as their father got sick and gave her and her sister up. He later died of this incurable disease.
- She grew up a cheerful, optimistic, very sensitive and generous person. As well as extremely impatient, working with dogged persistence to finish any task.
 Learning patience was her hardest lesson. She was quick to temper, but it didn't last, and she learned the secret of grace to overcome.
- She finished high school and 2 yrs later, arthritis attacked her body. After 1 more yr. of work, she was forced to quit, followed by 3 yrs of increasing helplessness.
- Both foster parents both passed away and she received the doctors verdict that she would be a helpless invalid the rest of her life.
- She began to write poetry to give herself solace in the long hours of suffering. Her poetry, written with twisted fingers, was beautiful and although written form the bed of affliction, in great pain, always had a touch of refreshing humor.
- Her disease and crippled body worsened over time but her faith in the goodness and mercy of God never wavered.
- For more than 40 yrs she suffered with agonizing pain!
- She died in 1932



Don't slander a Christian Brother 4v8-12

James is saying that destructive speech is actually a sign of self centered, self focused, un-humbled worldliness. The only answer is God's grace to change the heart.

The first act of slander in human history led directly to the first sin:

satan slanders God's integrity (Gen 3v1 - "Indeed has God said....."

satan slanders God's motives (Gen 3v5 - "God knows when you eat it, you will be like God.."

The slanderer destroys friendships

The slanderer inflicts deep wounds

The slanderer can destroy people

The slanderer stirs up contention

The slanderer spreads strife


